Omega Committee

- At our August 13 Board meeting, an Omega Committee was presented for consideration on the neighborhood's board based on the church's geographic influence in the neighborhood as allowed by our bylaws.
- The Executive committee voted to approve the Omega Committee, and confirmed William Allen as the representative. He can be reached at wallen@omegabaptist.org

- The Hope Center (housing Sinclair College, Mini-University Daycare Center, and Dayton Children's) will be open late in 2021.
- Construction traffic is supposed to approach from the circle drive, not from Harvard.
- The remaining tree on the edge of the property will remain, and the driveway plan has been adjusted to account for the tree.
- A miscommunication regarding the plan board's ability to govern the trees on the interior of the property, led to missed expectations regarding saving trees on the interior of the property.
 - Omega has not violated any rules regarding these trees and was within their right to remove them.
- Omega hopes to reinvigorate the park by next summer.
- Roberts Hall is scheduled to be demolished soon with partial funding from the Montgomery County Landbank approved on July 21 (\$150,000)

Philadelphia Dr.




- In July, the neighborhood discussed plans to make Philadelphia Dr. safer. Neighbors split primarily between bike lanes and turn lanes, with a few preferring that the parking lane remain.
- Here is our proposed plans from July (unedited for removal of streetlight at Forest Grove): <u>Link</u>
- This is the city's response from August: <u>Link</u>
- The lane on the northbound side is a parking lane, and not a turn lane.
- A group of leaders from the surrounding neighborhoods are going to meet with the city to discuss the best path forward for Philadelphia Dr. with the hopes to get a federal grant to make the street safer.
- Philadelphia Dr. is home to 4 of the 10 most dangerous intersections in the city according to an Elk & Elk Study: <u>Link</u>

Other Streets



- Salem Avenue Reconstruction planning sessions for Manhattan to Cornell are underway. Email <u>dvtfpres@gmail.com</u> with concerns
- Speeding concerns (Cornell, Catalpa, Harvard) can be sent to the DPD at <u>937-333-COPS</u> and ask for more speed patrols.
- We received petitions and information on how to add a speed bump to residential streets (Harvard & Cumberland).
- Criteria for a speed bump, 4 way stop, or intersection bumps
 - o 200 ft. from stop sign
 - 51% of housing units (excluding vacants) must sign a petition to send to city for review
 - Once approved, a ballot will be sent to affected property owners, asking if they approve the speed bump construction.
 - A $\frac{2}{3}$ majority positive vote is required to get the speed bump installed.
 - Due to Salem Ave. Construction, the streets department will not install speed bumps until Spring of next year.


It's been almost a year since we announce that the streetlights would be replaced. Due to neighbor complaints about the brightness and temperature of the bulbs, new ones are on order


